



On Dec 7th, in honor of the 65th anniversary of Universal Declaration on Human Rights, NCBI co-sponsored the Monterey Bay Chapter of the United Nation Association's annual Human Rights Day Luncheon at the Monterey Elks Lodge. It was an inspiring event and many fine human rights activists, including several NCBI members, have been honored at the event over the years with the Baha'i Human Rights Award. This year's honoree was the extraordinary Dr. Jan Knippers Black a professor at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, author of The Politics of Human Rights Protection (among others), and member of the Amnesty International's Board of Directors, Congratulations Jan!
