Alie Jones is a self-care advocate, writer, artist, and Creole mermaid. She believes that the best writing spaces are generative and embodied. Alie is deeply inspired by scholars like bell hooks, Ntozake Shange, June Jordan, and Gloria Anzaldúa. As an educator, she explores the intersections of power, praxis, and healing. She is the Director and Co-founder of *Black Freighter Press*, a revolutionary press committed to the exploration of liberation.

Alie graduated with a BA in Cinematic Arts & Technology from CSU Monterey Bay & a minor in HCOM Creative Writing & Social Action. She received her MPA from the Middlebury Institute of International Studies as well as a MFA from Mills College in Creative Writing. What Goals Do You Have as a Lecturer at CSUMB?

It is an honor to be back at CSUMB in the Humanities & Communication department alongside some of my former professors. My most impactful classes were in my minor concentration Creative Writing & Social Action. I have been writing my whole life but it wasn't until those classes that I was sharing my writing. I tell my students the story of one of my first classes with Deb Busman. We each had to choose a piece to recite on a microphone in front of the entire class and any guests we wanted to invite, I was terrified. I asked Deb if I could write an essay or do an in class presentation instead, she encouraged me to find something I'd be proud to share. I trembled through my ode and now I host, curate, and perform in spaces I never could have imagined. Before that class I remember believing no one would relate to my writing. My writing experiences in HCOM led me to explore CSU Summer Arts and connect with authors and educators I deeply admire like Roxane Gay, Lidia Yuknavitch, and Kiese Laymon.

I'm grateful I was able to explore the intersections of art, social justice, and storytelling. As an alum, my hope is that I am able to continue the legacy of Creative Writing and Social Action concentration cultivating spaces of belonging and resistance. Something I'm really proud of is my student Maria Zamudio performing her poem "Learning to cook" reflecting on class, justice, and family heritage. She shared this piece in our Environmental Creative Writing at the end of semester reading this past Fall and kicked off our Women's History month event on March 14th. It's truly a gift to witness someone go from a place of doubt in their writing to a place of courage. I know first hand that these spaces are stewarded with a lot of intention.






The Monterey County Black Caucus successfully secures \$1 million grant from the James Irvine Foundation
