Celebrating Queer Community Activists, Along the Rainbow!



I just want to take a moment to say how thoroughly I am enjoying the process of pulling together a celebration of queer community activists in association with <u>Monterey Peninsula Pride</u> this year. Since we launched MPP as a pride planning team of organizers in 2017 and as a fully-fledged non-profit in 2018, most years I have facilitated a post pride discussion panel following the annual parade and celebration.

These have been really fun!

This year is different in a number of ways. First off, it is a week *before* Pride. Typically the post pride panel is either a few hours after the Pride Celebration or its the next morning. Either way, as a volunteer starting at 9 in the morning, I am usually too wiped to attend the Pride After-Party. This

year, I plan to party hearty with the best of them!

My personal circumstances are also a lot different this year. Along with 84 other employees, as a result of an extreme budget deficit, I have taken up CSUMB's offer of a six-month salary buy-out to voluntarily separate from the university I have been part of since 2006. Three other LGBTQ+ community activists with long associations with CSUMB, Professors Deb Busman and Dave Reichard as well as Senior Chaplain Father Jon Perez are leaving as well -- that's over 80 years of service just between the four of us!

Wanting to celebrate my colleagues, I convinced them all to be panelists this year along with Monterey Peninsula Pride's primary founder, Tyller Williamson and the great JT Mason who was recently nominated for the annual Bahai Human Rights Award.

Delving into their histories in order to faithfully portray the depth and scope of their activism and community impact has been nothing short of inspirational. The abbreviated bios of two of our panelists, Deb Busman and JT Mason were featured in last week's *Along the Rainbow*. This week's edition features Dave Reichard; Father Jon and Tyller's bios will be featured next week.

I am grateful to <u>The Village Project, Inc.</u> (an LGBTQ+ friendly, predominantly African American counseling and family resource center) for hosting us this year and to Monterey Peninsula Pride for trusting me year after year to facilitate the panel. Although the panel will be recorded by activist videographer Wes White, streamed on Zoom (https://us06web.zoom.us/j/89267392538) and TVPI social media platforms, I encourage you to attend in person if you can. 

Along the Rainbow acknowledges that our local LGBTQ+ communities live and thrive on the traditional, ancestral territories and homelands of the Esselen, Rumsen, Costanoan and Ohlone people. As an oppressed community ourselves, we must acknowledge that we reside on land stolen from indigenous people through physical and cultural violence. That cultural violence included the transmission of colonial Christian homophobia and transphobia to indigenous communities through boarding schools and missions with the express purpose of suppressing Two-Spirit people who went from being regarded as respected members of their own indigenous communities to being regarded as deviants by European, Mexican and American settlers.



Reichard

Community Activist to be celebrated at Rainbow Panel Event

Dave's local activism started when he arrived in



1999 to teach as a part-time lecturer at CSUMB. In his early years on campus, Dave served as faculty advisor to the LGBTQ student organization, *All in the Family*. Because many of the students at that time feared being out on campus, they had meetings in Dave's shared office, ideal since it had no windows. From that experience, Dave learned how important it is for LGBTQ+ to be and feel safe, to be and feel welcome, and to have a sense of belonging.

In 2000, CSUMB LGBTQ community members (students, staff & faculty) organized on campus to help defeat Proposition 22, the Knight Initiative. Despite the best efforts of these campus organizers, it passed and defined marriage in any California statute as only between one man and one woman. Dave worked with students to help them understand what that meant—and how they needed to keep going, as organizing is a marathon not a sprint.

Another focus of Dave's organizing—promoting LGBTQ public history—emerged when he became involved in the *GLBT Historical Society* in San Francisco while commuting to work at CSUMB. It was at the GLBTHS that Dave developed his understanding of the real organizing power of community-based history. So, when the GLBTHS decided to open a new *GLBT History Museum*, Dave stepped up as an Associate Curator for several exhibits, including one section on queer youth organizing, something he was inspired to do because his work with CSUMB students. He also served on the board of directors, including a term as cochair. Dave left the board when he and his husband, Nelson, fully moved to the Monterey Peninsula in 2016.

After coming back to Monterey County, Dave wanted to help make LGBTQ history matter in our own local communities. Building on his experiences in San Francisco, he co-founded the *Monterey County LGBTQ History Project* which began as a collaboration with *Rainbow Speakers and Friends*. After a successful launch event at Father Jon Perez's *church in Marina*, folks began donating materials.

Dave organized venues to make these local histories more visible in our community. For the two years that Monterey Peninsula Pride was held in Seaside, for example, he created displays of local LGBTQ history and for several years, and also worked with students in his LGBTQ history course to uncover local queer and trans histories. Pride organizations

Dave's work with local Pride organizations dates to his very first years here. After meeting local activists Matt Friday and Brice Carlson in 1999, Dave got involved with Pride of Monterey County which organized early Pride celebrations in the 1990s and into the early 2000's here. For Pride in 1999 and 2000, Dave did everything from connecting Pride organizers with other CSUMB staff, faculty and students, to creating fliers, to working the BBQ grill on the day of Pride!

Once he moved to the area from San Francisco, Dave was one of the organizers and on the first board of Monterey Peninsula Pride, which sponsored the first pride march and celebration in many years on the Peninsula. Dave served on the planning committees for Pride in 2017 and 2018 (when it was here in Seaside) and in 2019 when it moved to Monterey. Dave was one of the organizers for both virtual Pride celebrations during the pandemic in 2020 and 2021, working with folks from all the local pride organizations to ensure continuity of the celebrations when they were unable to meet in person. Dave continues to volunteer with Monterey Pride today.

In his last couple of years before retiring from CSUMB at the end of June 2024, Dave stepped up as co-lead of the LGBTQ+ Employees Affinity Group. Most recently, Dave also served as the faculty director of the new Rainbow Raft Pride Center at CSUMB, a first for the campus. After a very successful launch event in May, the center is poised to become a hub for LGBTQ+ students and their allies on campus—a place to meet, gather, host programs and events, and provide resources.

The culmination of Dave's LGBTQ+ organizing and research is the June 2024 publication of *Here Are My People: LGBT College Student Organizing in California* which is on sale now at https://www.amazon.com/Here-Are-People-Organizing-Contemporary/dp/0820366331

About Karen Cusson, Tik Tok

Karen is a transgender woman who now, happily, identifies as She/Her. She would be quick to tell you that she has found incredible peace, authenticity, and wholeness as a result of conquering Karen Cusson

SHE/HER/HERS

"My name is Pastor Karen Cusson. I serve on the Board of **Directors of Salinas Valley Pride** Celebration and am a wellknown actor/director in **Monterey County's theater** community. I am in the process of writing my autobiography tentatively entitled "A Fire's Light". As a creator on TikTok, I encourage up to 20,000 weekly viewers to trust God and fearlessly be real, genuine and authentic. My congregation is, quite literally, the world! My message is that God loves us just the way we are!"



her fear of being herself and boldly embarking on her new journey.

Karen knew, at 8 years old, that the person she saw in the mirror was not who she really was, but in 1958, such a concept was totally unacceptable - her parents, her brothers, the whole world kept seeing her as a boy ... but inside of her was a girl screaming, "I am not a boy!"

During their teen and young adult years, Ken (that was what would eventually become their dead name), discovered that their greatest joy was in helping others. With their desire to do this, and their love of God, they discovered *The Salvation Army*. While in their Seminary, they met a very special woman, who would become their wife of 36 years and with this special woman, Ruth, would have three daughters.

After serving for over 20 years, Ken and Ruth left the Salvation Army in 1995, and came to Salinas where Ruth had grown up, to re-start their lives of serving. Here, they raised their family ... but lost their youngest to Leukemia at 7 years of age.

Ken continued their desire to serve God in a number of churches throughout Monterey County. Then in 2003, they discovered their ability to entertain audiences as an actor on local stages. Ken went on to play lead and supporting roles in almost every theatre company in Monterey County. That also lead to serving as President of the Monterey County Theatre Alliance for six years.

In 2013, Ken started serving the homeless community of Monterey County as the Executive Director of *Victory Mission*, in Salinas' Chinatown, where

they would serve for 6 years. During those 6 years, Ken was able to create new programs, re-model the facility, re-develop the appreciation of Victory Mission's programs for the homeless community and re-build the financial position of the Mission. During that time, they also served on the <u>CoC</u> <u>Leadership Council for Monterey County</u>, the Salinas Downtown Community Board, the Chinatown Business Committee and the Chinatown Homeless Action Team.

However, through all of that time, there was the constant, internal anguish of a woman, inside him, begging to live! After 17 years of marriage, Ken found the courage to come out as a Transgender woman, to her wife. When she did, Ruth amazed Ken by accepting her completely—even often suggested that Ken start their transitioning journey because Ruth saw the inner conflict that was so deep within. But Ken refused – Ken knew it would become a nightmare for her and their daughters because of the hatred for the LGBTQ community by the conservative Christian church. However, she promised her that if she could ever transition without hurting anyone else she would make it happen.

Sadly, Ruth died from breast cancer in 2017.

In 2019, after almost 60 years of wearing a mask that filled their life with internal anguish and constant duplicity, Ken kept their promise to their beloved Ruth and made the decision to let her... Karen ... out and live! After over a year in therapy, and numerous consultations with many doctors, and a LOT of prayer and research, she finally started their journey of full transition to becoming Karen.

Then, as a result, in 2022, Karen was asked to resign from her leadership position at Victory Mission.

In November 2020, Karen, answering a challenge from a friend to do so, started posting videos on TikTok talking about her life, as well as giving support and encouragement to the international LGBTQ community, urging us not to give up on God. She has created over 500 videos on TikTok, telling her story and sharing the truth of how God loves us ... just the way we are! She also holds live discussion sessions on TikTok twice a week. Her videos and live sessions have so far reached almost 6 million people, with close to 330,000 followers in over 24 countries.

During the LIVE sessions, she faces incredible hatred and opposition, fearlessly and sympathetically – answering questions, countering hatred with patience and understanding and giving suggestions for those seeking the courage to "come out" amidst a variety of difficult, challenging circumstances.

Karen is currently working on an autobiography tentatively titled "A Fire's Light". She is enjoying her "retirement" with her work on TikTok, the occasional acting/directing opportunity and playing with her best friend Willa (a Terrier/Chihuahua).

The Epicenter was launched through a partnership of Monterey County Child Welfare Services and VOICES (Voice Our Independent Choices for Emancipation Support). VOICES is the first youth-designed and youth-led program in the nation for transition-age foster youth. After successfully replicating its program in Sonoma and Santa Clara Counties, VOICES was invited by Monterey County Child Welfare Services in 2013 to launch a VOICES-like program in Salinas.

Beginning in January 2013, VOICES engaged Monterey County youth and adult leaders in a planning process to address the needs of current and former foster youth. Throughout the process, youth reported that the lack of a centralized, youth-oriented location makes it difficult to learn about opportunities and to access resources. Again and again, youth expressed the desire for a place with no closed doors: where they don't have to "qualify" for services because of their demographics or circumstances. Most importantly, they emphasized the need for a new Center to be positively oriented towards wellness and connection, not negatively oriented towards overcoming Monterey's gang problem.

The planning process included a comprehensive assessment of community readiness, the development of a team of nine youth-founders, and the creation of a highly effective Steering Committee, made up of leaders from Hartnell College and five County departments, including Mental Health, Child Welfare, Probation, Public Health and Health and Human Services. The Epicenter officially launched on September 4, 2014 with a Grand Opening attended by over 200 people. Among those attending were local elected officials, including but not limited to Monterey County Superintendent of Schools Nancy Kotowski & Supervisor Jane Parker, as well as local media representatives who highlighted the Epicenter on both radio and television news broadcasts.BTQIA+ community for a more

connected, celebratory, and inclusive Monterey Bay area.

OUR GENTE is the LGBTQ+ Services program of The Epicenter that exists to create safe environments and opportunities to affect positive change and growth for LGBTQ+ youth in Monterey County. Our Gente programming includes peer social support and community building for LGBTQ+ youth, community and agency trainings, special events, and peer support for parents and caregivers of LGBTQ+ youth.

QTYC (Queer/Trans Youth Collective) is a youth leadership program that provides workplace experience in a non-profit environment as an introduction to LGBTQ+ social advocacy and activism. Youth leaders are responsible for creating and facilitating Our Gente programming and offer peer support to other LGBTQ+ youth in the community.

Q-TURN is Our Gente's LGBTQ+ specific drop-in hours that happen every Thursday from 12 PM to 5 PM at The Epicenter. Youth participants are welcomed to an accepting environment where they can build community with LGBTQ+ youth and their allies and develop networks of support with their peers.

FLY (Families of LGBTQ+ Youth) is a social support group for the parents, caretakers, and adult family members of LGBTQ+ youth to help connect those people to peer support, to ask questions, and to learn more about the LGBTQ+ experience in a non-judgmental forum. FLY meetings take place on the third Wednesdays of every month at 6 PM at The Epicenter.


