That cultural violence included the transmission of colonial Christian homophobia and transphobia to indigenous communities through boarding schools and missions with the express purpose of suppressing Two-Spirit people who went from being regarded as respected members of their own indigenous communities to being regarded as deviants by European, Mexican and American settlers.





About Father

Jon Perez

Community Activist to be celebrated at Rainbow Panel Event

To the degree that I became a "activist" it was simply to have the right to hold my partner when he was dying.

Jon Perez grew up in a religious culture as opposed to a religious family. In fact, as a child he experienced religion as a refuge from an abusive dysfunctional family. He came to the recognition that he was gay after high school when he found himself in a relationship with a man – a relationship that he eventually recognized as a gay relationship.

Following a horrific car accident in 1986, Jon Perez moved back to the Monterey Peninsula from San Diego in order to be closer to his family. Jon's partner at the time, Michael Williams, was HIV + and Jon soon began volunteering at the Monterey County AIDS Project. In 1992, Jon participated with 10,000 protesters in Washington DC in a successful attempt to prevent cuts to AIDS funding. It was also one of the last times the AIDS quilt was displayed in full.

Like many gay couples during the height of the AIDS epidemic, Jon found that because there was no legal recognition of his partnership with Michael, he had no rights that he could exert when Michael was dying in hospice in 1990. An incident with a homophobic nurse who freaked out about Jon comforting his partner in his sick bed led to a law suit in which Jon won a settlement that allowed him to occupy an apartment at the hospice to support his partner after visiting hours. Jon took over Michael's position on the National Gay and Lesbian Board of the ACLU after he passed on in 1991.

Jon was working as a support manager for Jen Air Kitchen Appliances when Michael died. The cultural climate of time was such that he could not

tell anyone what he was going through at the time. Jon's subsequent corporate jobs included stints at Raytheon and General Electric.

Jon had an epiphany a few years later when he was helping at the altar at an Episcopal Church in Washington, he realized this this is what he is meant to be doing and he entered seminary in Seattle where he was on track to become a regional priest. Don, Jon's partner at the time was also dying of AIDS and became so angry in his final days that he cancelled his insurance, leaving Jon with \$250,000 in dept when he passed in 1995.

In Feb 1996, Jon officially became a social worker for MCAP where he managed the AIDS Drug Assistance Program. Also, in 1996, although not yet ordained, Jon was made the Vicar of Epiphany Episcopal Lutheran Church in Marina. He was clear at the time, that he might not precede to priesthood because he was gay as he recognized that some bishops were simply not going to ordain a gay person.

Nevertheless, Epiphany thrived under Jon's leadership. His congregation is the largest social service NGO facilitator serving Marina. Epiphany programs include the Thomas Carmen Food Pantry and Senior Breakfast Program. Over the years, Epiphany has hosted AA meetings, supported court mandated anger management classes, and stored tents and sleeping bags in their Emergency Closet for the homeless in collaboration with Marina police and the Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program (I-HELP).

After years of internal struggle, the Episcopal began officially ordaining gay priests in 2005, Father Jon Perez.

In conjunction with his service at Epiphany, Father Jon also serves as the senior chaplain for CSUMB and also served on the Lutheran Episcopal Coordination Committee and as an advisor to the Department of Defense Military Chaplains on LGBTQ+ Pastoral Care for which he was recognized by the Obama White House.

Father Jon is especially proud of Epiphany's cultural and political diversity. About 15 to 20% of the congregation is queer and indeed, Epiphany became a spot for the queer community to gather. From 1998 to the mid-2000's Epiphany hosted World AIDS Day commemorations with MCAP and John XXIII Ministries. Notably, vigils were held at Epiphany for both the 2016 Pulse Street Massacre in Orlando and 2022 Club Q shooting in Colorado Springs. Monthly meetings of Rainbow Speakers and Friends have been hosted by Epiphany for years. Father Jon has also, served as a board member of the Lesbian & Gay Rights Northern California Chapter of the ACLU, and as club advisor for the Pride Club at CSUMB. He is a proud recipient of the 2009 Ralph Atkinson Civil Liberties Award from the Monterey County ACLU for his work supporting marriage equality and civil rights for all during the campaign against Proposition 8.

Father Jon is currently celebrating 22 years with his husband Robert Munoz. He navigates the world with the help of his guide dog Arlington. Father Jon, Robert and Arlington will soon be retiring to Spain.

About Tyller Williamson, Mayor of Monterey

Tyller Williamson grew up in a military family. His mom served in the Navy for 20 years. After graduating high school, the Navy Academy Preparatory School in Newport, Rhode Island. When Tyller found himself struggling academically, he expected remediation and instead was summarily discharged. He now thinks his discharge was due in part to being clocked as a closeted member of the LGBTQ+ community who just wanted to "dance and sing". Years later, Tyller said reflected, "it was a very macho environment, very masculine. I'm about love and compassion and getting along."

After attending Junior College in San Diego, Tyller traveled with his family to Monterey where he attended Cal State Monterey Bay earning his Bachelors degree in Pre-Law Human Communications in 2013. Five years earlier, Tyller had volunteered for the 2008 Obama Presidential Campaign. In fact, Tyller took a year of absence from his studies at CSUMB in 2012 in order to help secure Obama's second term in office. Campaign staff were so impressed with Tyller's organizing skills that he was pressed to run the campaign out of the San Francisco headquarters as Deputy Regional Field Director. It was also during this time, that he came out fully as a gay man.

While Tyller was earning his degree at CSUMB, he also began working at the travel office of the Naval Post Graduate School. In over a dozen years with NPS he worked in various positions including as executive assistant to the chief information officer. After CSUMB, he enrolled in the Naval Post Graduate school himself and now has a Masters in Business Administration.

Much local Democratic Party activism surged on the Monterey Peninsula following the election of the 45th President of the United States, and Tyller was involved in the Democratic Central Committee for Monterey County and Indivisible Monterey Bay. Tyller was soon approached by then Seaside City Council Woman Kayla Jones to organize a gay pride march in 2017 in the City of Seaside. Tyller quickly recruited an organizing team and was the undisputed driving force in developing Monterey Peninsula Pride. In 2018, Tyller successfully ran for a seat on Monterey City's Council. Even more impressively, despite being vastly outspent by his incumbent rivals, Tyller was elected as Mayor of the City of Monterey in 2022 there by becoming simultaneously the first Black Mayor, the first Gay Mayor and the youngest Mayor in the history of Monterey.

As if running a city is not enough, in 2022, Tyller also joined the boards of the Community Foundation of Monterey County and the non-profit known as BLAAC (Black Leaders and Allies Collaborative). Tyller lives on Franklin Street in Monterey in a home he bought with his partner, Ivan.




